

These questions are designed to extend the impact of the weekend message. Use them to go deeper in your personal study time, with your family, and/or with a group.

This series from Acts 9-15 tells the story of Jesus' first disciples learning that the gospel is for all. It cannot be limited by race, by tradition, or even by persecution. It calls the church in every generation to embrace the unlimited mission of God.

- 1 EVERY DISCIPLE HAS... “a call waiting.”** Any move of God demands movement. Acts is the story of a church called to move, and chapter 13 is the genesis of Christian exodus. **Read Acts 13:1-3.** What can we learn from the leadership of the church in Antioch about hearing and responding to the call of God?
- 2** Jesus comes to everybody where they are, but he doesn't let anybody stay there. Discipleship is never static. **Read John 20:21.** Saved people are sent people. Does that apply to all of us, or just some of us?
- 3 THIS CALL IS... not limited by demonic opposition.** **Read Acts 13:6-12.** Any move for God is a move against the devil. How does Satan try to stall the mission of God today? What is our confidence that his efforts cannot prevail?
- 4 THIS CALL IS... not limited by disappointing circumstances.** Paul had to deal with many hardships on the mission field. What are some of the hardships missionaries face today, and how can we support them? Note: one important thing we can do is pray daily — go online to thehills.org/3000hours
- 5 THIS CALL IS... not limited by difficult people and places.** **Read Acts 13:15-52.** Paul's teaching and ministry in Pisidian Antioch divided the city. What is it about the gospel that causes it to get such mixed reviews, and how should we respond to those who reject the good news?
- 6 THIS CALL IS... unlimited because of a death-defying event.** **Look back at Acts 13:37-39.** Paul's emphasis is clearly on the resurrection of Jesus. Why is this the ultimate game-changer, and why should the truth that Christ is risen drive Christian mission?
- 7 EVERY DISCIPLE is “on call.”** But the great struggle is to decide which of the many calls in our lives are most important. Never forget that every Christian is a missionary. What can we do to make sure we are living for a calling and not just settling for a living? How do we determine if that means we move or stay put?
