



Jesus did not come so people far from God could find him. He came to find people who were far from God. There are many ways to get lost, but there is one way to be found—through the message and ministry of Jesus. And once Jesus finds you, he bids you to join him in his search and rescue mission.

Week 1: Find Your One... Who Has Wandered

1. Rick began by reminding us that “A core conviction of our church is that every 1 needs Jesus.” What are some ways our church consistently keeps that part of our mission in front of us? Follow up: **Read Luke 19:10.** With that verse in mind, “**Who’s your 1?**”
2. **IMPORTANCE OF FINDING: Nothing matters more than finding some 1 who is lost.** **Read Luke 15:1-2.** What stands out to you the most from these verses? Follow up: **Read Luke 15:3-7.** *We all know some 1 who has found themselves in a place they never intended to be.* What is our responsibility in those instances? Share some stories of finding people who’ve unintentionally wandered away.
3. **Read Luke 5:27-32.** What resonates with you the most from this story?
4. **IMPORTANCE OF FRIENDING: See patients, not problems.** *Behind every patient is a story that should make us more patient.* What can you do to learn to see people more like Jesus sees them?
5. **IMPORTANCE OF FRIENDING: Stay near, not far.** *Lost people are not the seekers; followers of Jesus are.* Why is that distinction so important? How should that change our approach to finding people?
6. **IMPORTANCE OF FRIENDING: Say “start”, not “stop.”** *Jesus called the absolute worst version of Levi.* How should that change our approach to welcoming people on the journey?
7. **Any 1 can become Jesus’ friend.** What impacted you the most from the video testimony of Manuel Galindo? Follow up: **Read Matthew 18:12.** Spend time praying that God would help us become more like Jesus as we find the 1’s who have wandered off and specifically pray for your 1.
