

In this two week series we are going to reexamine and recommit to some specific goals we have as our way of making and growing followers of Jesus through our Nations & Generations vision.

Week 1: Asking for Nations

- 1. **GOD'S "NATIONS" AGENDA: Read Genesis 18:18.** Why is it important to remember that God's redemptive plan has always focused on the nations (ethnicities)?
- 2. The gospel's aim is to give God the global, multi-ethnic family He wants. Read Matthew 28:18-19. What role does our church play in this aim and what role do you have in participating in it personally? Follow up: Read Revelation 7:9-10. How can this glimpse of the future God wants (and will get) help us take more intentional steps towards that today?
- 3. OUR "NATIONS' STATUS:
 - **Goal 1: See 1825 people surrender to Christ and be baptized.** So far, we have witnessed **558 baptisms through the first 614 days of our vision**. Thank God for this and take a moment to pray for the "1's" you know who still need to surrender and take this next step.
 - **Goal 2:** *Become a multi-ethnic church.* Our recent survey revealed that we are **81%** white and **19%** people of other ethnicities. For those under 40 the number is 74% / 26%. Take a moment to ask God to help us break down any walls in our hearts that make it hard for us to welcome people of all ethnicities.
 - Goal 3: Be a church of at least 5 campuses. Campus #4 will launch in Dallas sometime in the first half of 2024. Spend a few moments praying for this campus and help spread the word.
 - Goal 4: Engage members as advocates for 25 asylum-seeking families or individuals in our community. To date we have served 20 asylum-seeking families as advocates. They need 9 new advocates for 2024. Is this something God might be asking your group to do together?
 - Goal 5: Help launch and/or support 15 new multi-ethnic church plants. In the first two years of our vision, we have helped plant 8 new churches. Pray for our church plants.



- Goal 6: Support the Livingstone International University community in Uganda through prayer and by sending 20 members to teach, equip, and encourage. We have sent 5 of our members so far. Is this something God might be asking you to do?
- Goal 7: Reach the unreached by launching and supporting 5 church planting movements and by supporting Bible translation efforts in 5 new languages. We are currently supporting 4 of each of those. Praise God for the success in this area so far and for the seeds that are being planted.
- 4. Which of these seven goals resonate with you the most? Why? Follow up: If you have personally been involved in one of these goals already, share that experience. What has God been teaching you during this season of ministry?
- 5. Ask God this question, What next step should I take to engage with one of these goals more in the next year? Then take 1-2 minutes in silence listening for a response or an impression. Follow up: What is something God might be asking you to consider doing?
- 6. **THE "NATIONS" CHALLENGE:** Everyone likes the idea of diversity more than the experience. Why do you think that is so? **Read Acts 10:34-35.** What can we learn from Peter's experience? Follow up: What are some practical ways you can reach out to people who are different from you? What is keeping you from taking these steps?
- 7. The multi-ethnic church displays the wisdom of God and declares the triumph of Christ. Read Ephesians 3:10-11. What encourages you the most from those verses? Follow up: Spend some time praying together as a group for God to give us the courage to do what He wants us to do.
